Some lovely goats present. Gorsefield Cylviane, reigned supreme on the day. She is an excellent example of the pure Toggenburg breed. Her udder is well fixed back and fore, with a good milk yield running through. A fine achievement for a Toggenburg first kidder. Reserve Best in Show, Landsmead Tigerrose, a very smart upstanding, BA type AOV with a neat udder. Special mention to one young exhibitor, Sam Owen, he turned his goats out beautifully, and his goatling Gallant Myrtle, went onto achieve Best Goatling, which was very much deserved.

JUDGES COMMENTS: for Kernow

A lovely show, Gorsefield Cylviane, a fabulous example of the Toggenburg breed, best running through, oozed quality and ring presence, followed by Leatland Sonya, AOV reserve, milking well and very sound at 6 years old. Although the goatling classes weren't big the quality was very good. Best goatling Gallant Maple immaculately turned out a credit to her young owner Sam Owen.

JUDGES COMMENTS: for Stithians

An excellent show, with first class facilities and stewarding. Had it rained there was room in the marquee for several sections of the show to be judged! PRESIDENT'S BIT

I thought that I would do some research on our favoured animal “the goat”. Did you realise that it is a member of the Bovidae family but also called Caprinae as it is closely related to sheep? Both are considered to be in the goat-antelope subfamily. Goats are probably one of the oldest domesticated species, being used for their meat, milk, fibre and skins, more especially in the poorer parts of the world. There are over 300 distinct breeds! Their best known quality is their adaptability to the wide range of circumstances that they live in. The most recent genetic analysis confirms the archaeological evidence that the wild Bezoar ibex of the Zagros Mountains is the likely original ancestor of all domesticated goats today. The earliest remnants of domesticated goats dating 10,000 years before today have been found in Ganj Dareh in Iran. Their remains have also been found in archaeological sites in Jericho and other Western Asian places between 8-9,000 years ago. Neolithic farmers not only used them for meat and milk, as we do, but also their dung for fuel, and their bones, hair and sinew for clothing, tools and for building materials! I find all this amazing. We think that we are adaptable and use our goats’ products to the best that we can but did we ever consider using them as building materials??

Goat milking

We've enjoyed keeping Goats for 3 years now and they are providing us with a ready supply of milk for drinking, yogurt and cheese making. The pigs also love any surplus milk mixed with oats as a porridge for their breakfast. Back in January I realised that my hands were getting more painful with every milking.

As we plan to keep and milk goats for many years to come we decided to embrace technology and look out for a milking machine. They are basically the same as for cows but with a different vacuum pressure, clusters and a faster pulse rate. An initial skirmish on the internet told us that they are very expensive new and you can pay a lot of money for second hand machines that look like a pile of rust on wheels.



We went to the Devon show and found a machine but the salesman knew very little about it and despite promising to send us some more info we never heard from him. At the Royal Cornwall show, in the brief spells between rain showers and showing our goats, we went walkabout to search for more options. We found 5
